

Death of Wm. Clegg.

Mr. and Mrs. Robert Broadhead returned Friday evening from Prospect, Idaho, where they went to attend the funeral of Mrs Broadhead's brother, Wm. Clegg, who died March 15th and was buried on the 18th. Wm. Clegg was well and favorably known in Heber city where he lived for a number of years and served in several public positions. He will be remembered as the water master for several years. His death has been a severe blow to his aged parents who have long since passed the prime of life and entered the state of existence known as old age. The following

was furnished us by the deceased's father: Wm. Clegg was the son of Jonathan and Ellen Clegg. He was born in Lancashire, England, February 22nd, 1842. was baptised into the church of Latter-day Saints when eight years old and re-baptised in 1856. He crossed the plains in Ed. Martin's hand-cart company in 1853 with his parents and settled in Provo. He came to Heber in 1859 where he lived until he went to Idaho about nine years ago, except a few years that he lived in Cache valley.

The cause of his death was inflammation of the body brought on by hard work.

He leaves a wife and nine children to mourn his loss besides his aged parents and a host of friends.

He lived and died a faithful Latter-Day Saint and on the 7th of March he bore a noble testimony at the fast meeting, only eight days before his death. Elders Love and Bybo spoke at the funeral services which were well attended and thirty-six teams followed the remains to their final resting place.
